The GJHP Musical is a NO-CUT program and is open to all Glencoe students in 6th-8th Grade! This is one of the largest productions in the area with a professional team, large set, awesome lights & sound, and live band! Students must register before auditions (Deadline: December 8).

The \$700 registration fee includes participation in all rehearsals and performances PLUS:

- cast welcome party
- costumes (except basic items)
- ticket to Brigadoon at New Trier HS
- dinner at dress rehearsals
- official show t-shirt
- another show/event TBA!

AUDITION & CASTING INFORMATION

The GJHP Musical is a NO-CUT program for 6th-8th graders. All who audition will be cast in the show!

You must REGISTER (and pay) in order to receive the audition packet, private webpage access, and choose your Audition timeslot. If you would like to request a scholarship, email contact@gihp.org.

An email with instructions for how to access the **AUDITION MATERIALS AND TIMESLOT SIGN-UP** will be sent to registered families on **Thursday**, **November 21 at 5pm** – so all registered students have the same amount of time with the materials and chance to get their preferred audition timeslot. Those who register after that date/time will receive access instructions in an autoreply.

An **AUDITION WORKSHOP** will be held on Wednesday, December 4, 3:30pm-5:45pm in Misner Auditorium. The workshop is optional but highly recommended as we will be reviewing all materials and teaching the songs and the dance combination for the audition!

AUDITIONS will be held on Monday, December 9 and Tuesday, December 10, 3:30pm-5pm and 4:30pm-6pm in Misner Auditorium. Don't forget to sign-up for an audition time (starting Nov 21 at 5pm).

Auditions will consist of the following:

- TWO Monologues from the audition packet. Monologues DO NOT need to be memorized.
- **TWO Songs** All song options will be taught at the Audition Workshop. Students should pick the sonas that best showcase their voice and the type of role they may be interested in.
- Dance Combination performed in small groups
 This will be taught at the Audition Workshop. A video will also be posted online after.
- EVERYONE must act, sing & dance at auditions even if they want a non-speaking/singing role.

All participants must turn in the following hardcopy forms at their audition (from the audition packet):

- Audition Form (with information about the performer used for casting)
- Conflict Sheet (detailing the student's conflicts for January 6-April 29, 2025)
- Cast Contract (signed by the student and a parent/guardian acknowledging expectations)
- Contact & Costume Sheet (listing important contacts as well as sizing for costumes)
- It is very important to be thorough & honest when completing all forms! They are used to create the schedule and could impact casting. Students must arrive on time with all paperwork ready!

CALLBACKS will be held on Thursday, December 12 and Friday, December 13, 3:30pm-7pm. We may add an additional day on Monday, December 16 if needed. The Callback List will be posted online by Wednesday, December 11 at Noon. Not everyone will receive a callback or will need to attend all callback days or stay the entire time. Students should be prepared to sing, act and dance again and be ready to submit a video if necessary or requested.

IMPORTANT: Do not worry if the student does not get a callback. Everyone will be in the show, we just already know where to place them. Students may be cast in a lead role without a callback!

The CAST LIST will be posted online Friday, December 20 at 5pm. Some roles will be double cast with specific dates & counterparts to be determined later! Everyone will appear in all four shows!

REFUND TERMS: If you decline your role and drop out of the show <u>before January 1</u>, you will receive a full refund but be charged a \$25 cancellation fee. If you drop <u>after January 1</u>, your refund will be prorated and you will be charged a \$25 cancellation fee. There will be no refunds after March 1.

You may not be called every day or for the entire time! The schedule will vary from week to week depending on what is being worked on. Some weeks you may be called for fewer days than others, with all being called for more rehearsals in the weeks leading up to performances.

Please list all conflicts for January 6 – April 29, 2025 on the back of this sheet. In addition to recurring conflicts that occur every week, please include one-time conflicts such as vacations, doctor appointments, etc. that cannot be changed. All conflicts must be recorded on this form prior to auditioning to be considered excused. So please check your calendars!

We will do our best to work around <u>one</u> pre-approved, once-a-week, standing conflict. <u>This is more difficult for lead roles and your availability may be taken under consideration when casting.</u> Due to our tight rehearsal schedule, we cannot cast students who have more than once-a-week conflicts. NOTE: We can work around the Basketball schedule (since it only overlaps in January) and Boys Volleyball for some roles. We can also accommodate Featured Dancers/Tumblers with limited rehearsal availability! Please note all those commitments on the next page! <u>You MUST notify Samara</u> AND include on the conflict sheet if the student plans to try out for the Volleyball team!

This Contract details expectations and must be read by the student and at least one parent or guardian!

Please initial	each statement and sign at the bottom to confirm. This form must be turned in at auditions.
	Student will have a positive attitude and be respectful of all students and adults participating in <i>Newsies</i> .
	Student will demonstrate appropriate rehearsal behavior which includes no cell phones out during rehearsals and arriving on time with all materials and proper footwear.
	Rehearsals are on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays, 3:30pm-5:45pm with additional days/times for tech and dress rehearsals leading up to performances.
	Rehearsals in April may run later with make-up days as necessary.
	Attendance is mandatory at all scheduled tech & dress rehearsals and performances.
	A full rehearsal schedule will be distributed on January 6. You may not be needed every day or for the entire time.
	In order to be eligible to participate in <i>Newsies</i> (attend auditions, rehearsals, performances, or other program-related activities), the student must be passing all my classes with a C or better, attend a complete day of school (8:20am-3:24pm) and participate in all classes. (Special cases are subject to individual review. Example: An exception may be made due to an appointment previously approved by the school.)
	Students are allowed one recurring weekly conflict, however, recurring AND one-time conflicts must be listed on the conflict form in order to be excused. These include one-time dates (Examples: Dr. appt, trip) in addition to conflicts that occur every week.
	Conflicts should be avoided during the final month of the program (after Spring Break) and will not be allowed during Tech or Dress Rehearsals or Performances.
	Student will not attend rehearsals if ill and will notify the Director as soon as possible
	Three unexcused absences could result in the loss or reduction of role, regardless of size Excused absences include those listed on the conflict sheet, illness, or family emergencie Unexcused absences include missing rehearsal, arriving late or leaving early.
	Student will follow all health protocols put in place by District 35 and GJHP and understands that if they continue to intentionally break these protocols, they may be asked to leave the program.
	If the student has been exposed to COVID-19, or is exhibiting COVID-like symptoms, they must mask at rehearsal and/or stay home until they are verified negative.
	Parent and student acknowledges the rehearsal time and commitment required for this production and will consistently read emails and review important materials.
	Parent understands that they (or members of their family) will serve as a participating member of a volunteer committee. We understand that the success of this production depends on the participation from cast members and adult volunteers.
	Most importantly, this is an ensemble of like-minded performers, tech and production staff. We work together as a family. Student understands that all conflicts will be resolved without the use of degrading language, violence, or hurtful behavior.

ABOUT NEWSIES

CHARACTER LIST

Some roles will be double-cast or combined. Gender listed is for the character not the performer! We are open to gender-blind and re-gendered casting (for some roles) and have a lot of flexibility. We welcome all levels of experience and there are parts for all different skills – including for those that want to focus only on dancing.

THE NEWSIES

JACK KELLY (Male) The charismatic leader of the Manhattan newsies, is an orphaned dreamer and artist who yearns to get out of the crowded streets of New York and make a better life for himself out West. Fiercely protective of his best friend, Crutchie, Jack isn't afraid to use his voice to attain better conditions for the working kids of NYC. Though living on the streets has given him a tough-guy exterior, Jack has a big heart and can demonstrate a sweet vulnerability – especially when it comes to bantering with a certain female reporter. Jack needs a great pop tenor voice and sense of physicality. Sings solo, many lines, some dancing, stage combat. Must be comfortable in a "romantic" role. Vocal Range: A4 – Bb2

CRUTCHIE (Any Gender) A dedicated newsie with a bum leg that's painful but helps sell more papes. Though s/he walks with the assistance of a crutch, Crutchie doesn't let it define him/her; when in a jam, Jack's best friend relies on a goofy sense of humor and optimistic resilience. Crutchie is the heart of the resistance. The performer in this role must be able to dance enthusiastically in character while still physically portraying Crutchie's "bum" leg. Sings solo, many lines, some dancing, stage combat. Vocal Range: A4-C3

DAVEY (Male or Any TBD) Les's straight-laced, bright big brother starts selling newspapers to help his family earn a living, but becomes swept up in the fervor of the strike. A leader in his own right who is learning to use his voice to uplift others, Davey is the brains of the resistance. A thinker, raised in a home as opposed to the other Newsies, Davey is the book-smart counterpoint to the other kids. Must have a great contemporary tenor/alto voice. Sings solo, many lines, some dancing. Vocal range: A4-D3

LES (Any Gender) Davey's cheeky younger sibling, is inspired by the freedom of the newsies and loves their independent lifestyle. A precocious and natural newsie, Les is an intuitive salesboy and a pint-sized charmer. Should present as younger than the other newsies. Solos, lines, dancing. Vocal Range: Bb3-Db3

FEATURED NEWSIES, including ALBERT, BUTTONS, ELMER, FINCH, HENRY, IKE, JO JO, MIKE, MUSH, RACE, ROMEO, SPECS, SPLASHER, and TOMMY BOY, are hard-working kids of New York City who go on strike for a livable wage. This core group of newsies works the same neighborhoods as Jack, Crutchie, Dave and Les and function as a family that cares for and helps one another. All of these roles are gender flexible and have multiple lines and solos and/or dance features and stage combat. Performers in these roles must create unique and specific characters with physical and vocal details that distinguish them from the other newsies. We may combine certain characters or add more, depending on the needs of the show and this cast.

SPOT CONLON (Any Gender) The proud leader of the Brooklyn newsies, boasts an intimidating reputation and a singing solo in "Brooklyn's Here." Must have a strong presence. Likely will combine with other roles/ensembles.

ALLIES & ANTAGONISTS (The Friends & Foes of the Newsies)

KATHERINE PLUMBER (Female) An ambitious young reporter, works hard to make a name for herself as a legitimate journalist in a time when women aren't taken seriously. Quick, funny, and resourceful, she boldly captures the voice of a new generation rising in her coverage of the strike. While she usually has no time for cocky young men, she makes an exception for Jack. Katherine should have a great contemporary pop voice with a high belt – diction is key. Dance solo in "King of New York." "Romantic" role. Vocal Range: F5-A3

JOSEPH PULITZER (Male) A pompous businessman, owns the World and is concerned solely with the bottom line. Katherine's no-nonsense father, Pulitzer doesn't sympathize with the strikers, but he does eventually – and grudgingly – respect Jack. Sings "The Bottom Line" and has many lines. Vocal Range: F4- C3

MEDDA LARKIN (Female) Inspired by vaudeville performer Aida Overton Walker, this big-voiced saloon singer and star of the Bowery offers her theater as a safe haven for the newsies. An astute entertainer with great comic delivery, she's a good friend to Jack and stands firmly behind the newsies in their fight for justice. Sings solo, some dance. Comedic actress required. Vocal range: E5-F3

HANNAH (Female) Pulitzer's practical and insightful secretary. Some solos in "The Bottom Line."

BUNSEN (Any Gender) Pulitzer's bookkeeper, comes up with the ideas to raise the newsies' price per paper. Some solos in "The Bottom Line."

SEITZ (Any Gender) Editor, advises Pulitzer, but ultimately admires the newsies. Some solos in "The Bottom Line."

WIESEL (Any Gender) Or "Weasel," runs the distribution window for the World and knows most of the newsies by name. Assisted by the intimidating Delancey brothers, who keep order by any means necessary, Wiesel is Pulitzer's disgruntled paper- pusher. Requires an exaggerated, cartoonish vocal and physical performance.

OSCAR and MORRIS DELANCEY (Male) Tough brothers who work at the distribution window for the World, take the side of the publishers in the strike and are known to use their fists to make a point. These roles require two performers who work together well with good comic timing but can also be physically intimidating. Although they do not dance, these roles still require a strong physical performance with excellent self-control for stage combat sequences. Several lines, stage combat.

SNYDER (Any Gender) The crooked and sinister warden of The Refuge, a filthy and horrible orphanage, is concerned only with catching enough kids to keep his government checks coming. Though he doesn't work for Pulitzer, he's happy to team up with him to take down the newsies and get his hands on Jack. This role requires a strong physical and vocal character performance.

OTHER ROLES (Will double with other roles/ensembles)

GOVERNOR TEDDY ROOSEVELT (Male / Possible Cameo) A well-respected lifelong public servant, inspires Jack to stand up to Pulitzer.

MAYOR (Male) The Mayor of New York City rebuffs Pulitzer's attempts to shut down the newsies' strike.

JACOBI (Any Gender) Allows the newsies to congregate in his/her restaurant to plan their strike – when s/he doesn't have any paying customers, that is.

NUNZIO (Any Gender) Pulitzer's barber.

BILL & DARCY (Any Gender) The upper-class kids of a publisher and William Randolph Hearst who join the newsies' cause. They help Katherine break in to use the basement printing press to print the newsies' paper.

GOONS (Any Gender) Assist the Delanceys in roughing up the newsies at the end of Act One.

SCABS (Any Gender) Three newsies who are hesitant to join the strike. Gender: both Character Age: 10 to 20

GUARD (Any Gender) The Guard removes the newsies from Pulitzer's building. Gender: both

THE BOWERY BEAUTIES Female performers at Medda's Theater. Sing and dance in Medda's numbers.

STAGE MANAGER (Any Gender) Introduces Medda's act

NUNS (Female) The nuns offer breakfast to the hungry newsies. Sing in "Carrying the Banne.r"

PHOTOGRAPHER (Any Gender) Takes the triumphant photo of the newsies at the end of "Seize the Day."

WOMAN (Female) A newspaper customer.

POLICEMEN (Any Gender) Assist Snyder and turn against the newsies in the fight that concludes Act One.

FULL (SPOILERY) SYNOPSIS

ACT ONE

As Jack Kelly is savoring the last few moments of quiet before the sun rises, he shares with his best friend Crutchie his rooftop view of the city and his dream for a better life out West ("Santa Fe - Prologue"). At dawn, the newsies sing about their life and their work ("Carrying the Banner"), introducing this ramshackle group of young friends. They make their way to the distribution window for the World, where they pick up their daily stacks of papers to sell from Wiesel, who runs the window, and Morris and Oscar Delancey, goons who work for the World. Davey and Les, brothers trying to earn money for their family, meet the newsies and try to learn the ropes. Jack agrees to partner with the boys since Les's young age will help him sell more papers, although Davey is skeptical.





Meanwhile, Joseph Pulitzer, publisher of the World Newspaper (joined by his loyal staff Hannah, Bunsen and Seitz) expresses displeasure at the declining sales of his newspaper and vows to increase profits ("The Bottom Line"), even if it is at the expense of the hardworking newsies.

At the end of the day, it's clear that Les is a natural newsie. Before Jack and the brothers can part ways, a man appears and chases Jack. Davey and Les follow Jack's lead, running through the alleys of New York City and finding safety in Medda's Theater.

Jack introduces them to Medda Larkin, one of the Bowery's most famous performers. Jack explains that the man chasing them is named Snyder; he runs The Refuge, an orphanage that he keeps in squalid conditions and embezzles from. He's had it out for Jack ever since he escaped. Medda offers her theater as a safe haven, and they stay to watch her perform ('That's Rich'').



During Medda's performance, Jack notices Katherine Plumber, a bright young reporter he saw earlier that day. A smitten Jack makes several attempts to flirt with her, but Katherine, quick-witted and ever-professional, cleverly rebuffs him. While the Bowery Beauties perform their routine, Jack resorts to sketching a portrait of Katherine ("I Never Planned on You / Don't Come a-Knockin""), and leaves it for her to find.

The next day, as the newsies gather at the distribution window, the boys are outraged to learn that Pulitzer has increased their price for newspapers - they can barely afford to eat as it is! Prompted by Davey, the newsies decide to form a union and strike ("The World Will Know"). After a successful first day of striking, newly elected union leader Jack Kelly assigns some kids to spread the word to newsies in other boroughs.

Katherine arrives, hoping that the newsies will give her an exclusive for the Sun. Jack tells her to be at the distribution window the next morning; not only will the newsies prevent others from selling papers, but they plan to stop the delivery carts as well. He tells her that they all have a lot riding on her reporting skills, and Katherine gets to work writing her breakout article ("Watch What Happens").

The next day, Jack arrives to find that only a few kids have assembled to strike. He urges Davey to convince the small group not to back down. When scabs arrive to take the newsies' place, Jack asks them to stand in solidarity with all the city's exploited working children. The scabs throw down their papers, just in time for Katherine and her photographer to snap a victorious photo ("Seize the Day").





But soon the newsies engage in a fierce fight with the Delanceys, Wiesel, and the police. Snyder scares Jack away, but not before he watches the Delanceys take down Crutchie and carry him off to The Refuge. Reaching the temporary safety of his rooftop, Jack paces, feeling guilty about leading the kids into danger. He looks out over the city and longs to escape ("Santa Fe").

ACT TWO

Battered and bruised, the newsies lament the previous day's events at Jacobi's Deli. Amid rumors that Jack was captured, several newsies wonder where he is. Katherine arrives with a copy of the story she published in the Sun, complete with a front-page picture of the newsies. Ecstatically, they thank her and celebrate their - and Katherine's - fame ("King of New York"). Meanwhile, Crutchie writes a letter to Jack from The Refuge expressing that he feels no ill will toward Jack and urging the newsies to stick together ("Letter from The Refuge").





Davey, Les, and Katherine find Jack back at Medda's Theater and try to convince him to come back to the fight. Jack refuses, saying that they can't win against a man as powerful as Pulitzer. The three convince Jack that theirs is a fight worth fighting ("Watch What Happens - Reprise"); Jack finally agrees, and the kids plan a rally.

Discovering Katherine's story, Pulitzer furiously resolves to take down Jack. Just then, a cocky Jack arrives to announce the newsies' rally. Pulitzer assures Jack that no paper will cover it - and if it's not in the press, it never happened. He then reveals Katherine, exposing her as his daughter, and Snyder, who emerges from the shadows. Pulitzer offers Jack a choice: get sent

to The Refuge or renounce the strike and leave New York with pockets full of cash. The Delanceys escort Jack to the cellar, where an old printing press rests, to ponder his decision ("The Bottom Line - Reprise").



That evening, Brooklyn newsies cross the bridge with Spot Conlon, their leader, to join newsies from every borough at Medda's theater for the rally ("Brooklyn's Here"). Davey gives an inspiring speech, riling up the newsies about their progress. However, Jack appears and tells them to go back to work because they are no match for Pulitzer. Jack accepts his payoff money at the door and exits quickly.

On his rooftop, Jack finds Katherine looking through his drawings of The Refuge's bleak conditions. He snatches them from her and they argue fiercely.

Katherine shares her plan to have the newsies distribute an article which quotes Jack on the exploitation of working kids and calls for a citywide strike. Before heading to the old printing press Jack recently discovered, they share their hope in each other ("Something to Believe In").

With the help of Katherine and her well-connected friends, Darcy and Bill, the newsies sneak into Pulitzer's cellar to print their paper ("Once and for All"). The kids distribute the pamphlet all over the city. Pulitzer's office is flooded with angry calls from every corner of New York. Having read the Newsies Banner, Pulitzer is furious at the kids' attempt to thwart him. Jack, Davey, and Spot show up ("Seize the Day - Reprise") to personally deliver the news and say that the kids are willing to make a compromise. Pulitzer refuses to back down until Governor Roosevelt appears with Katherine and Jack's



drawings of The Refuge. Alone, Jack and Pulitzer come to an agreement they can both live with - the price increase is reduced by half, and publishers will buy back any unsold papers. The strike is over!

Outside, Jack announces the end of the strike. Crutchie appears amid the jubilation, followed by a handcuffed Snyder. Despite his dreams for Santa Fe, Jack realizes that the newsies are his family and Katherine gives him something to believe in - so he's staying put for now ("Finale Ultimo").
